Article 6: To see what sums of money the Town will vote to raise and appropriate for the Water Enterprise Fund for the ensuing Fiscal Year 2021. (Town Manager)

Bob Palleschi asks at 7:30pm has the cost increased significantly since he was here.

Town Manager states yes each year.

Substitute motion to strike out the bottom line but the math doesn't work by Peter Manoogian.

Peter Manoogian explains the amendment at 7:33pm that this budget is going up 10.3%. He is not comfortable and we are being boxed in to a nearly 11% increase. We should pass this to the MWRA. We never see what this money goes to. Never see water pipes replaced. 4% increase is justifiable.

Town Moderator explains that we need to adjust the other numbers to move the bottom number.

Town Manager states at 7:36pm this is way above what the Town is charged from the MWRA. He explains the other fixed cost in the increases; employment benefits increase, water project, salaries. In the past we got rid of all the preventative and it increased later on. It would be negligent not to have preventive maintenance. It would be a mistake not to support this.

Steve Divirgilio speaks at 7:38pm there are both positive sides from both. The indirect costs have been going up. This water fund is a cash generating fund for the rate payers. We are draining the water fund. Both Water and Sewer funds we need to keep an eye on and help us in the future.

Bob Palleschi speaks at 7:40pm explains when he was the chairman for the finance committee when he developed this formula and it came down to that if touches water it is an overhead indirect expense. Overhead needs to be monitored closely.

Peter Manoogian speaks at 7:42pm Is there a \$1m retained earnings in the Water account.

Town Manager speaks at 7:43pm said that there is \$1m.

Peter Manoogian at 7:44pm if voted in are we boxed in at a 10.3%?

Town Manager speaks at 7:44pm as the commercial higher rate payers reduce use and demand effects the other payers. What funds we have and rates will use going forward. No recommendations on rates yet.

Wendy Hatch speaks at 7:45pm she has spent a lot of time with the Abrahams Group on this subject. Since many business have been closed, the next billing circle will be substantially lower. There is consumption that the town lost. This has to be taken inter consideration from the historical usage and what could it be. Gone into great details and use different formulas as things go back into some sort of normalcy. Indirect costs are reviewed annually.

Bottom line reduced \$6,969,328.00 reduction.

Bob Palleschi speaks at 7:49pm about the retained earnings.

Town Manager answers at 7:50pm we didn't do the work on the infrastructure and preventative maintenance. Cautions having zero in the stabilization fund is not okay.

Amendment by Peter Manoogian at 7:51pm

Bill Brown will be supporting this amendment because rise in the rates. People are financially hurting. This is above a modest increase.

Bob Long speaks at 7:57pm is the \$90,000.00 is the repayment of the MWRA Loan and are we still doing this on a yearly bases? Aren't the funds audited? Didn't see a report to town meeting members.

Town Manager speaks at 7:58pm on reports online. Rate increases this is not this, because this not that.

Wendy Hatch speaks at 7:59pm the \$90,000.00 is capital outlay equipment on pay as use go cash bases. Yes we still participate in the MWRA program in DPW. The DPW Director put out bid for the replaces and new equipment.

Bob Long speaks at 8:00pm about the audits? Can TMM see these audits.

Town Manager states this information is on line and is pretty detailed.

Peter Manoogian suggests that it has to do with retained earnings and would reduce to 7%. Who is kidding who!

Steve Divirgilio speaks at 8:02pm on retained earnings and it shouldn't be spent. Most of the revenue on the commercial base will be diligent. On the Amendment if you decrease the direct costs wouldn't it money the general fund will not acquire.

Town Manager states that is correct.

Chris Riley speaks at 8:04pm what is the ball park impact to residents?

Town Manager states the impact is \$0 to the residents. Maintain the same level of services.
