Finance Committee Chairman, Ken DePatto speaks on the Special Town Meeting Articles at 7:41pm. The Finance Committee reviewed and made recommendations on all 12 articles.

Joseph Vecchione IV, Cliftondale Revitalization Committee speaks at 7:42pm, thanking his committee members. The last 12 months they met 5 times and made site walks of the area. The purpose of the committee was making recommendations for the area in business growth, parking, traffic and red tape issues. The deliverable of the committee includes a comprehensive report that meets and exceeds the goals set out from planning dating back to 1982 to present date (list of short term and long term investments). Cliftondale is part of the Town's Master Plan goals. One of the articles tonight is dealing with Cliftondale issues. Ask the Town Meeting to accept this report of the committee, dated March 7, 2022. Although much work is still needed in Cliftondale, the Committee and completed its tasks and asks the Town Meeting dissolve the committee.

He is speaking on the Vocational School Assessment, we can have a public discussion, establish and fund it; \$500,000.00. The Vocational school has had a six year average of 190 students. Last year dropped to 170 students and next year is 155 students. Need to continue a conversation on funding for this school without having significant impact on the Town's operating budget. He hopes Town Meeting will support this article.

The next article is the pumper truck we need in the next 4 years. These are much more expensive. Please vote in support of these articles for public safety needs. The ladder truck will be used as a back up in 2 years replaced with the new one.

Martin Costello Precinct 10 speaks at 8:20pm regarding the letter from Chief of Fire Michael Newbury, asking about having until the 15th of July to get this price for the equipment. Asks a

question to the Town Manager or the Fire Chief are we locked into this price or will it be increased down the road?

Town Manager, Scott Crabtree answers at 8:21pm the Town needs to order that the truck by the 15th to get that price. This is the base price but need to order the hoses and equipment.

Bill Brown, Precinct 6 speaks at 8:22pm asking how old the ladder and pumper trucks are and which pumper?

Town Manager will let the Chief answer.

Chief of Fire, Mike Newbury at 8:23pm states the ladder truck is 17 years old, you get 15 to 20 years for this type of apparatus. There is no trade in value for the Fire Truck after 20 years. There is 3 years of useful service left. Engine 2 is the pumper truck and it is 19 years old. Looking at 4 year plan to replace both these trucks. The price is locked in for delivery, it's a build spec and unique to each community. Once you sign the contract it is locked in until delivery.
