Use of Containers at Riverside Cemetery

The type of container allowed must be rectangle and can have a maximum size of 24" long by 8" wide. These types of containers can be purchased at a local florist or home improvement store. Memorial planters and containers with legs that are within the size limit are also allowed.

Approved container size:



CONTAINER MAY NOT EXCEED 24" LONG BY 8" WIDE

<u>CONTAINER MUST BE PLACED IN FRONT OF THE HEADSTONE WITHIN</u> <u>THE 12" PLANTING ALLOTMENT</u>

SOME CONTAINERS ARE NOT SUITABLE FOR SNOW OR THE WINTER. THE CEMETERY WILL NOT TAKE RESPONSIBILITY FOR ANY DAMAGE TO THEM.

ONLY ONE (1) CONTAINER PER PLOT IS ALLOWED

Use of Artificial Flowers at Riverside Cemetery

The use of artificial flowers is allowed year round, if they meet the following requirements.

Flower stems must be securely placed in a rectangle container (24" x 8" maximum size), and the container must be placed in front of the headstone within the 12" planting allotment.

NO ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS MAY BE PLACED IN THE GROUND AT ANY TIME

ALL ARTIFICIAL FLOWERS MUST BE IN AN APPROVED CONTAINER (see above)



Please note:

No plantings, artificial flowers stuck in the ground or upright monuments are allowed on single graves at any time.

Flat markers may have a container that has legs on it so that it can easily be moved for grounds maintenance.

The cemetery is not responsible for flowers or decorations placed on lots or graves.
