

## REOPENING

The tables below were adapted from the Reopening Massachusetts, Guidance for Industries in the Reopening Plan as of May 18, 2020.

All businesses are required to follow Mandatory Workplace Safety Standards and Sector specific safety protocols and best practices as outlined on the mass.gov website. They can be found here. All of the information is subject to revision based on the latest public health data.

Businesses that were allowed to continue operations and those deemed essential, including:

- Banks
- Financial Services
- In-house services (Nannies, Babysitters)
- Real Estate Open Houses

were required to comply with the Mandatory Workplace Safety Standards and any applicable sector specific safety protocols/best practices by May 25, 2020.

Phase 1	May 18th/25 <sup>th</sup> Safer at Home Advisory Gatherings <10 People
Phase 2	Minimum of 3 weeks from May 18 <sup>th</sup> (or longer) depending on health data trends. (Potentially June 8 <sup>th</sup> /15 <sup>th</sup> ) Business and Recreational Travel Discouraged Gathering Size TBD based on health trends
Phase 3	Potentially June 29 <sup>th</sup> /July 6 <sup>th</sup>

PHASE 1 (May 18 <sup>th</sup> /25 <sup>th</sup> )	
Businesses	Comments
Auto-dealers and wholesalers	For Curbside Pickup and/or Delivery Only. Follow guidelines for non-essential retail car dealerships found in the Essential Services FAQ. <i>See Phase 2 below.</i>
Car washers	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Construction	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Drive-in movie theaters	Must follow Mandatory Workplace Safety Standards
Driving Schools	Currently allowed to offer classroom instruction on-line. <i>See Phase 2 below.</i>
Firearms Retailers and Shooting Ranges	
General Office Spaces	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Hair Salons and Barbershops	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Home Remodeling	All construction businesses; Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Hotels and accommodations (including short-term/private vacation rentals by owner)	Currently open to provide services to essential workers and vulnerable populations. Additional guidance may be provided to hotels/lodging before Phase 2. <i>See Phase 2 below.</i>
Houses of Worship	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
In-Home Installations	Construction related (i.e., painting, repairs etc.). <i>See Phase 2 below.</i>
Lab Space	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Libraries	For Curbside Pickup and/or Delivery Only; <i>See Phase 2 below.</i>
Pet Grooming	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Restaurants	Continue to offer take-out and delivery options. <i>See Phase 2 below.</i>
Retail (clothing, toys, jewelry, nursery/garden stores that do not sell food, adult use cannabis)	For Curbside Pickup and/or Delivery Only. <i>See Phase 2 below.</i>
Recreations/Outdoor	Comments
Beaches	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Golf	Currently allowed with restrictions. Follow guidance in the Essential Services FAQ
Fishing, Hunting, Boating	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Parks	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Outdoor Adventure Activities (including ski areas summer activities, zip-lines and mountain biking)	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening
Outdoor gardens, zoos, reserves and public installations	Refer to Detailed Guidance for reopening

PHASE 2 (Potentially June 8th/15 <sup>th</sup> )	
Businesses	Comments
Auto-dealers and wholesalers	Browsing inside with restrictions
Casinos	Hotel and Restaurants only. Casinos and hotels attached to them should follow the guidelines for each section of the property (e.g., hotel, restaurant, etc).
Driving Schools	Behind the wheel training or observation of another student driver. RMV is developing comprehensive guidance for permit testing, road tests and driving schools.
In-home Installations	Non-construction related (i.e., carpet install, home theaters, security systems)
Libraries	Browsing inside with restrictions
Other Personal Services (Nail Salons, Day Spas, Massage Therapy, Tattoo Parlors, Electrolysis Studios)	
Restaurants	Can begin to open dining areas. Additional guidance may be provided before Phase 2.
Retail	Browsing inside with restrictions
Recreation/Outdoor	Comments
Other outdoor recreation such as miniature golf, batting cages, go-karts	
Outdoor performances	Some activities will be allowed
Summer camps	Recreational Day Camps
Youth Sports	Some activities will be allowed
PHASE 3 (Potentially June 29 <sup>th</sup> /July 6 <sup>th</sup> )	
Businesses	Comments
Amusement Parks	TBD, Either Phase 3 or 4
Bars	Those establishments that only serve alcohol and do not have kitchen areas that prepare food on-site.
Casinos- Gaming Areas	
Casinos-Theatres/Arenas	Phase 3 to 4
Gyms, Fitness Studios	Evaluating earlier opening of personal training and outdoor classes

Performance venues (Concert Halls, Theatres)	Large performance venues are an exception and will open in Phase 4 following guidance for other large venues. Some outdoor venues may begin opening in Phase 2.
